### **A radical transport system**

**China's urban population is growing quickly.** With many more people also able to afford cars, China's cities now have some of the biggest traffic congestion problems in the world.

**But one Chinese engineer, Youzhou Song, has** designed an exciting solution: the straddling bus. The bus, which looks like a train, goes across and above part of the road like a moving bridge. It holds up to 1,200 passengers on the top level while cars continue to drive beneath. Although it only travels at about 40 kilometres an hour, it will never have problems with traffic jams. It is as wide as two lanes of the road, but it won't slow down the traffic.

**The bus runs on a combination of electricity and solar** power, so it also offers a much greener, cleaner and quieter form of transport. It is three times faster, and ten times cheaper to build than the same length of underground railway. Designed with a huge window in the top of the bus, it is also a lighter and more cheerful way to travel!

**If you're worried about the bus crashing into other** vehicles, don't be. A system of lights and alarms will stop this from happening. Youzhou Song has even designed escape doors which open at the side in an emergency, just like on an aeroplane.

**If tests on the new technology go well, who knows?**  
We may all be looking forward to a new era of city travel!
