

## Definitions bingo

a) Match the places in the city to their definitions.

airport		one or more buildings where you can get higher education
art gallery		a large open area where you can buy fruit and vegetables, and sometimes clothes, too
bowling alley		a building with a lot of small working places for large companies
car park		a large open area where you can play a game kicking a ball into a goal
football pitch		a building where you can report a crime or do official paperwork
market		a shop where you can buy newspapers and magazines
newsagent		a large building where passengers can catch a train
nightclub		a building where you can play a game throwing a big ball to knock over fifteen pins
office block		an establishment, generally open until late at night, where you can get alcoholic drinks, food and music
playground		a large open area where passengers can catch a plane
police station		an open area where children can play
railway station		an open area with a net in the middle to play that sport
running track		a building that shows paintings and other works of art for sale

an open area where you can train for several sports

university



a large open area where drivers can leave their cars

b) Choose 9 words and drag them into the grid to play the game.

c) Listen to the clues in the order indicated by the numbers (no cheating!) Drag the words back to the red boxes when you hear them.

If you have dragged all the words back to the red box before you have heard all the clues, you win!!
