This is a quote...

...woven into your writing because the quote starts in the second sentence

...woven into your writing because your own writing precedes the quote

... dump

... precede by your lead-in which flows into the comma

... which is not woven into your own writing

Eurylochus is cowardly and has a negative effect on the men's ability to make good choices. While Odysseus is away in the cave, he tells the men, "Better open your lungs to a big sea once and for all than waste to skin and bones on a lonely island!" (1012, lines 876-878)

---

This is a quote...

woven into your writing
dump
both woven into your writing and a quote dump
neither a quote dump nor woven into your writing
without a full stop at the end and therefore incorrect

What do square brackets mean?

[square brackets] show I have added and changed a word to make it flow better

[square brackets] show I have added or changed a word to make it flow better

[square brackets] show I have added or changed a word or left out a word or phrase to make it flow better

[square brackets] indicate the page number

[square brackets] indicate the page number and line

What is true about somebody who knows how to quote?

Be flexible with how little of the beginning of a quote you are going to use

Open and end with quotation marks like “that“

Open and end with quotation marks like „that“

Put the page numbers and lines in brackets after the full stop

Put the page numbers and lines in brackets after the quotations mark

Play with how you word your text and quote lead-in to make the quote fit

Never ...

place a quotation into your sentence

explain the quotation's significance

summarize the plot before/after the quotation

decide on the important segment of the quotation

just put a quote in for the sake of putting it in

should it be hard to hear whose words (yours or the author's words) are used when read out loud

👉 **Warrant** - explains how your detail/quote backs up the claim and explains the detail/quote further



👉 **Evidence** – back up your point with quote or detail from source
