Changdeokgung Palace (창덕궁)

Changdeokgung Palace was always the preferred royal residence. It's where the king and royal family lived their daily lives. It's not one building, it's a complex of buildings, and each served a different purpose. Some are accommodations (적음), some are libraries, dining rooms, and meeting rooms, among

other uses.
