However, these adverbs can be also used with **present perfect simple** to indicate unfinished actions.

Note: used only with **present perfect simple** to indicate unfinished actions:  
**ALWAYS      STILL      YET**

ADVERBS USED WITH THE PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS.	ADVERBS USED WITH THE PAST PERFECT SIMPLE.
SEVERAL TIMES MANY TIMES BEFORE FOR SINCE	NEVER EVER BEFORE ALREADY JUST YET SINCE FOR
HOW LONG...? ALL DAY	HOW MANY TIMES...? ONCE TWICE THREE TIMES SEVERAL TIMES MANY TIMES
<b>Example:</b> Susan <b>had been waiting</b> in the same place <b>for</b> hours.	<b>Example:</b> She said grandpa <b>had smoked</b> two cigarettes <b>since</b> he was a boy.
