A **verb tells what** something is or does. A verb tense tells when the action took place. There are three tenses.

Past tense	Present tense	Future tense
Tells what already happened. Sally woke up at 6:00 this morning.	Tells what is happening now. Sally eats her breakfast now. It is 8:00 am	Tells what <b>will happen</b> in the future. Sally <b>will attend</b> her online class at 9:00 am.
