

FUTURE TENSES

SIMPLE / CONTINUOUS / PERFECT / PERFECT CONTINUOUS

DIRECTIONS: Draw a line from the sentence to the correct tense being used.

SIMPLE

I will have worked 10 hours by 11pm.
I am going to have worked 10 hours by 11pm

CONTINUOUS

I will work tomorrow.
I am going to work tomorrow.

PERFECT

I will have been working 10 hours when you start.
I am going to have been working 10 hours when you start.

PERFECT CONTINUOUS

I will be working when you arrive tonight.
I am going to be working when you arrive tonight.

Future Continuous vs. Future perfect continuous

DIRECTIONS: Look at the sentence. Decide if it should be the future continuous OR the future perfect continuous. Then use either "will be" or "going to be" and the verb /ing/ for continuous OR "will have been" or "going to have been" for the perfect continuous.

EX> The baby will be sleeping in the afternoon. (sleep)

EX> The baby is going to be sleeping in the afternoon. (sleep)

EX> The baby will have been sleeping for two hours by 2pm (sleep)

EX> The baby is going to have been sleeping for two hours by 2pm (sleep)
