How was this made?

(Steps highlighted in yellow are essential, the others are optional)

1. If you are in a hurry, download this worksheet's editable version to use it as a template, or download its .pdf version and skip step 2.
2. If you have more time or a more artistic inclination than me, click on TeacherARG's name on the Community section to have a look at a much more beautiful contact sheet.
3. Upload a .pdf version of your contact sheet (or this one if you skipped step 2).
4. Draw an empty box around "click here" in the first paragraph, but leave it empty for the moment.
5. Draw some empty boxes for the person who wants to contact you to write their message.
6. Save your worksheet and generate a custom link to it.
7. Fill in the fields group and subject with the text "contact me". Leave "name" empty for the teacher who wants to contact you to write her/his name or nick.
8. Open and edit it to add the custom link in the "click here" box. Save it again.
9. Edit the information in your profile ("My account" section). Post a link to your worksheet, or better still (Loop's idea), use a tinyurl link with your custom link in the field for "Website or blog", where it will show up as a link.

If you skip steps 4, 7 and 8 you can only be contacted from your profile page. If you don't, anyone can look up "contact me" and your user name to find your worksheet (unless you make it private).
