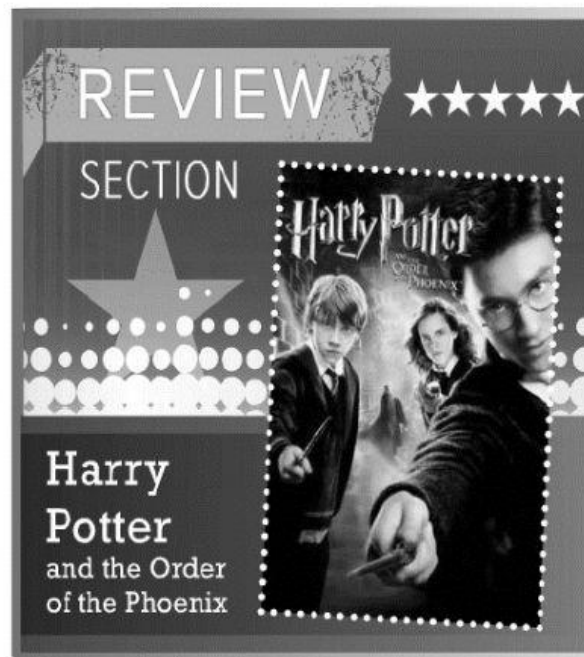

If you like action and mystery, try *Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix*. Based on the novel of the same name, this terrific movie, which is part of the popular *Harry Potter* series, definitely exceeded my expectations.

The story is mainly about Harry and his closest friends, Hermione and Ron, joining the Order of the Phoenix, which is an organization created by Dumbledore, the director of the ancient Hogwarts School of Magic, to fight the evil Lord Voldemort, who tried to kill Harry when he was just a baby.

The movie captivates, not only because of the amazing special effects but also because of the intriguing new characters we meet. It also focuses on Harry's first love, a gorgeous student called Cho Chang. However, despite the romantic element, this story is much darker and tenser than the previous ones.

Although it's rather long—over two hours—fanatical Potter and J.K. Rowling followers might be a little disappointed, as important parts of the original story are left out. Because of that, those who haven't read the book may find it difficult to understand the plot.

Despite these minor issues, in my opinion, this is the best *Harry Potter* movie as it combines the fascination with wizards, the problems and dilemmas of teenagers and the magical world of Hogwarts extremely well. I'd say it's a must see and I'd certainly recommend it.
