

# Grammar: **OBJECT PRONOUNS**

Look at the following table about **OBJECT PRONOUNS**.

SUBJECT PRONOUNS	OBJECT PRONOUNS
<b>I</b>	→ <b>me</b>
<b>you</b>	→ <b>you</b>
<b>he</b>	→ <b>him</b>
<b>she</b>	→ <b>her</b>
<b>it</b>	→ <b>it</b>
<b>we</b>	→ <b>us</b>
<b>they</b>	→ <b>them</b>



Object Pronouns substitute a noun / expression that is the Object of a sentence.

- These Pronouns are placed after the verb:  
Mary **loves** Peter. = Mary **loves** him.
- Object Pronouns can follow a preposition:  
She thinks **about** Peter.  
= She thinks **about** him.
