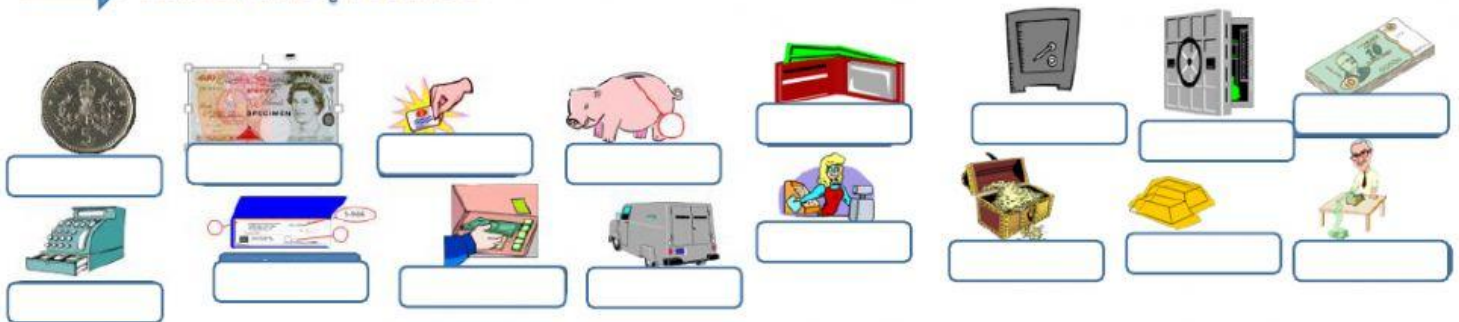

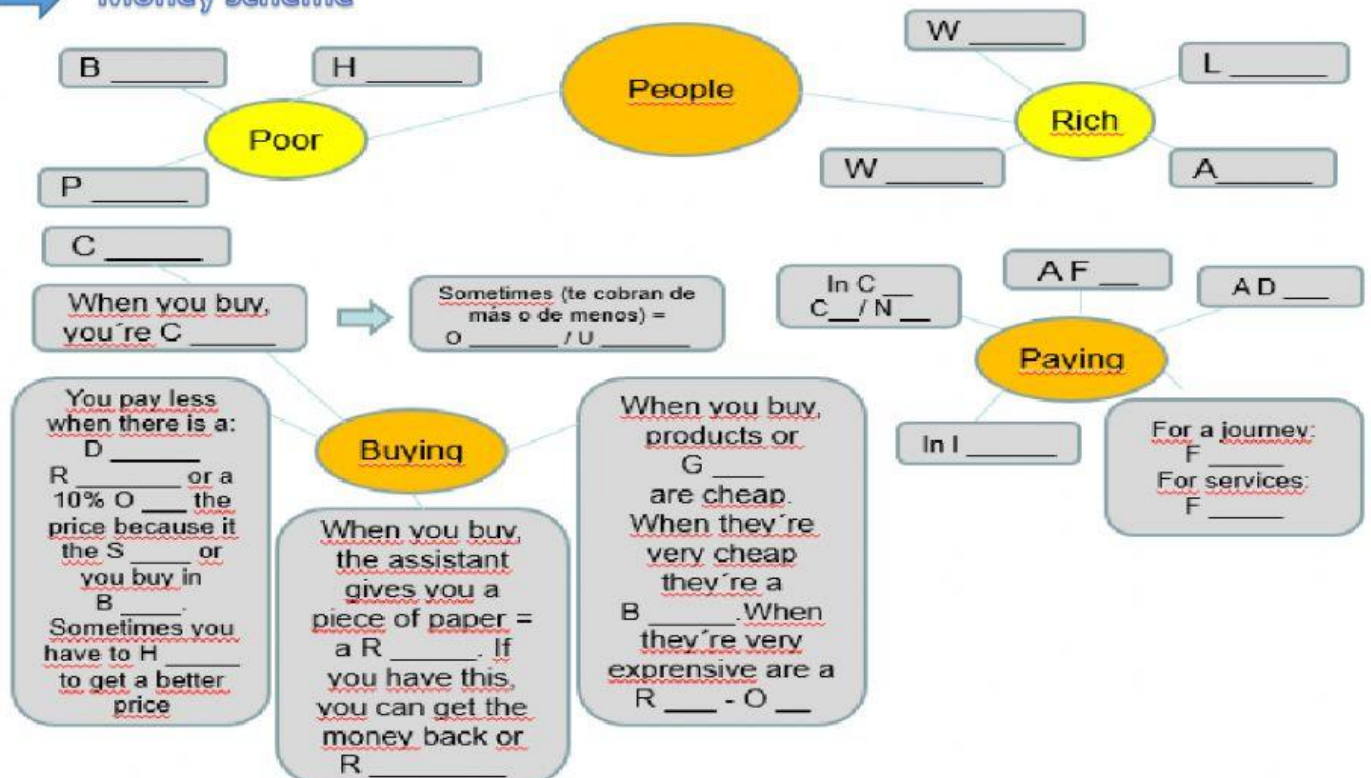

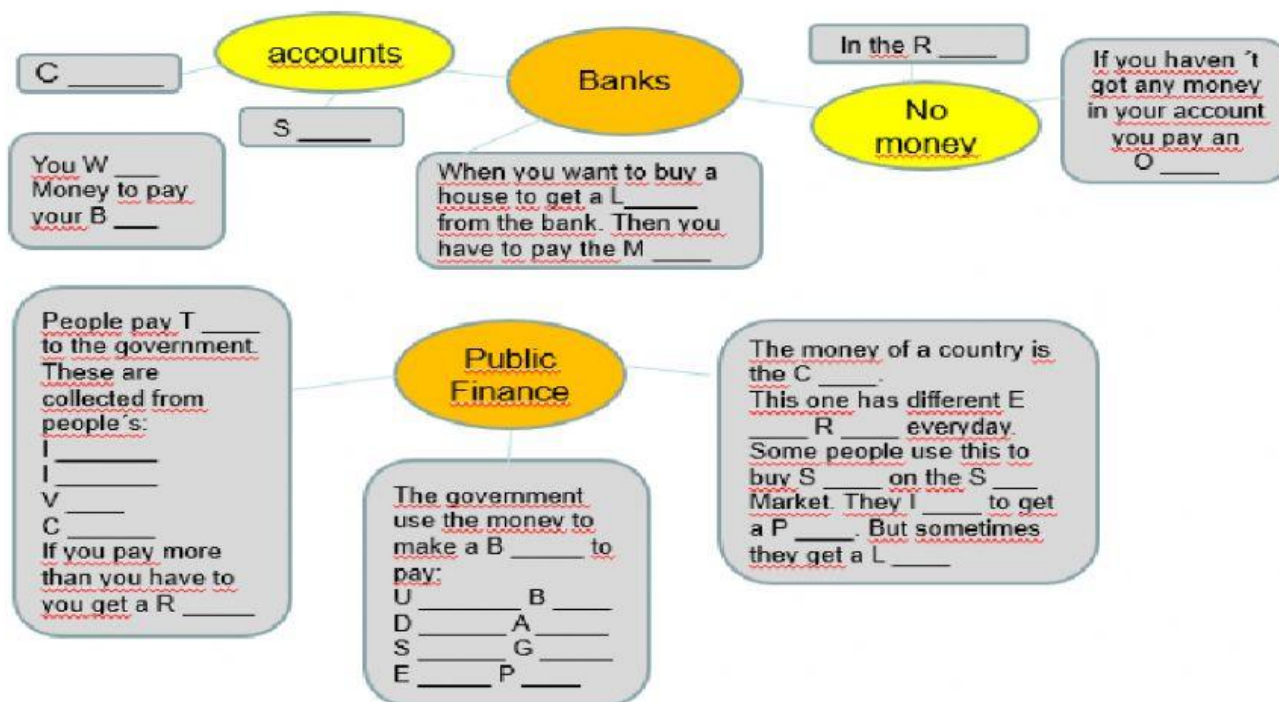

## 1 Nouns for money or payments

- \_\_\_\_\_ the money that is available to a person or organization
- \_\_\_\_\_ a sum of money that is given by the government or another organization to be used for a particular purpose, e.g. education
- \_\_\_\_\_ money that a bank lends and somebody borrows
- \_\_\_\_\_ an amount of money you pay for professional advice or services, e.g. to a lawyer or architect
- \_\_\_\_\_ the money you pay to travel by bus, plane, taxi, etc.
- \_\_\_\_\_ the amount of money sb asks for goods and services, etc.
- \_\_\_\_\_ money that you keep in the bank and don't spend
- \_\_\_\_\_ money that you give to an organization such as a charity in order to help them
- \_\_\_\_\_ a sum of money that must be paid as punishment for breaking a law or a rule
- \_\_\_\_\_ one of a number of payments that are paid regularly until sth has been paid for
- \_\_\_\_\_ a sum of money that is given as the first part of a larger payment
- \_\_\_\_\_ a legal document that says what is to happen to sb's money and property after they die
- \_\_\_\_\_ the amount of money that you owe to a bank when you have spent more than is in your bank account

## Listening: attitudes to money
