

• *Stative verbs*

Stative verbs describe a state rather than an action (*like, love, hate, look, seem, want, need, forget, remember, know, suppose*). They do not usually have continuous forms. Some stative verbs can have continuous forms, but they differ in meaning.
I think he's doing his homework. (= I believe)
I'm thinking about going to the gym. (= I'm considering)
