1. Affirmative form

FUTURE: AFFIRMATIVE FORM			
	WILL	Acción (verbo)	Complemento
I	will	live	in Australia
You	will	walk	in the park.
He	will	run	tomorrow
She	will	catch	the ball
It	will	watch	TV
They	will	make	a sandwich
We	will	read	a magazine

I will = I'll
 You'll
 He'll
 She'll
 It'll
 They'll
 We'll

Contraction:
pronoun + will

Correct: They'll
Incorrect: Susan and Mary'll

Examples: correct → **She'll** travel next month. ✓
 Incorrect → **Susan'll** travel next month. ✗

	WILL	not	Acción (verbo)	Complemento
I	will	not	live	in Australia
You	will	not	walk	in the park.
He	will	not	run	tomorrow
She	will	not	catch	the ball
It	will	not	watch	TV
They	will	not	make	a sandwich
We	will	not	read	a magazine

will **not** live = I **won't** live (I won't live in Australia).

He won't
 She won't
 It won't
 They won't
 We won't

Contracción:
will + not = **won't**
