WHO - You use who at the beginning of a relative clause when specifying the person or group of people you are talking about or when giving more information about them.

Who should be used to refer to the subject of a sentence.

Who is the 'doer' of the action.

EX.

My sister, who sent me a package, lives in Kansas City.

WHOM - You use whom at the beginning of a relative clause when specifying the person or group of people you are talking about or when giving more information about them.

Whom should be used to refer to the object of a verb or preposition.

Whom is the 'receiver' of the action.

EX.

My sister, whom I sent a package, lives in Kansas City.
