We use Second Conditional to express suppositions or statements contrary to reality. The If- clause is in the Past Simple and the main clause goes with would + Infinitive.

Example:

If Clause

If I studied

Past Simple

Main Clause

I would pass the test.

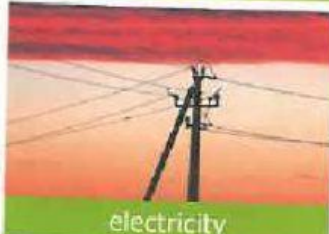
