4.5 Present Continuous, be going to and will

- We use the Present Continuous for fixed arrangements:
*I can't go shopping tomorrow at five. I'm **playing** tennis with Joy. (I've already made an arrangement with Joy.)*
- We use be going to + infinitive to talk about intentions or plans:
***Are you going to invite** your aunt to the party?*
- We use will + infinitive for decisions made at the moment of speaking. We often use *I think* with will:
*I think I'll **ask** Luke for help.*
