

The Simple Present Tense

Remember: When talking about the daily activities or general truths about **one** person or thing, place an **'s'** at the end of the action word.

If the action word ends with **ch, sh, s, x** or **z**, add **'es'** at the end of the word.

If the action word ends with **y**, change the **y** to an **'i'** and add **'es'**.

When talking about more than one person or thing, do not add 's' to the end of the verb.

For example: Many children play in the yard.
