Adverbs of Manner

Adverbs describe verbs. Adverbs of manner usually go after the verb or at the end of the sentence: She walks quickly.

- (1) Many adverbs are formed with **adjective + -ly**.
- (2) For adjectives **ending in -y**, change **y to i** before adding **-ly**.
- (3) Not all adverbs end in **-ly**: **far, fast, high, well**.
