



Unreal Uses of Past Tenses

In English Past Tenses do not always refer to a situation in the past. They can be used to refer to unreal situations in the present or future. Let's have a closer look at this.

CASE 1 - IT'S TIME YOU DID SOMETHING

It's time Jack went on a diet



! You could also use It's high time/ It's about time to make the meaning more emphatic

- It's past midnight. It's time you went to bed.
- It's about time the government reduced taxes.

! You should use would rather + bare infinitive when there is no change of the subject, e.g. I'd rather not talk about this!

- The roads are icy. I'd rather you did not drive now.
- Would you rather we invited our neighbors for dinner?

CASE 3 - I WISH / IF ONLY

I wish my teacher were not so strict.



! With wish, you can use I wish I were/ I wish he were instead of I wish I was/ I wish he was.

- I wish I had his mobile phone number. I'd call him.
- I wish he were not such a boring person.

CASE 4 - UNREAL CONDITIONS - 2nd CONDITIONAL

If I lived in the Medieval Ages, I would be a knight.



! Note that the main clause can contain 'would' 'could' or 'might'.

- If I were you, I wouldn't go out with that girl.
- If I had free time, I would learn Spanish.
