Zero conditional

Use the zero conditional for facts, things that are generally true or that you believe to be true. You can use **if** or **when** and the meaning doesn't change. Both parts of the sentence are in the present simple.

The two parts can come in any order. Examples:

You get orange **if** you mix red and yellow.

You get orange, **if** you mix red and yellow.

I get excited **when** I dance the "carnaval".

When I dance the "carnaval", I get excited.

The two parts can come in Example:

You won't pass your exams if you don't study.

If you don't study, you won't pass your exams.

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
