

## ASK QUESTIONS

## 1. Ask subject and object questions with WHO.

Examples: Lisa likes **Jason**. → Who does Lisa like?  
**Lisa** likes Jason. → Who likes Jason?

1. **My brother** works in a hospital. \_\_\_\_\_

## 2. Ask subject and object questions using WHAT.

Examples: Mary uses **Mark's phone**. → What does Mary use?  
**Accidents** happen every day. → What happens every day?
