Reported speech: questions

1) Yes-No questions

<u>Direct speech</u>: Lucy: "Do you have a mobile phone

Reported speech: Lucy asked me if had a mobile phone

Reporting verb for a question (asked, wanted to know)

Subject changes

Verb tense changes

Punctuation

"IF" or "WHETHER" for Yes/no questions

2) WH-questions

<u>Direct speech</u>: Lucy: "What time did you arrive"

Reported speech: Lucy asked me what time had arrived

Remember that the auxiliary verbs (DO, DOES, DID) are NOT USED in reported questions

Questions with the verb to be and with can, may, might, could, will, etc

<u>Direct speech</u>: Sam: "Where sthe book?

Reported speech: Sam asked me where the book was

<u>Direct speech</u>: Sam: "What can we do tomorrow?"

Reported speech: Sam asked me what we could to the following day

The word order is different in direct and reported speech. When reporting

a questions it becomes **SUBJECT + VERB** (in the previous tense)
