- I'm making a deduction or a speculation about the past. I'm almost sure.

2) I can't have forgotten it at home.

- I'm almost sure that something did not happen or it is impossible.

3) "she may have had a lot of things to do".

- It is possible that something happened or was true.

4): I should have heard you before!

- Someone did not do the right thing. Express regret or criticism
