



PRESENT PERFECT



- a) We use the Present perfect to talk about our experiences. (Relevant experiences)
 - Irene has played volleyball in USA. (Relevant experiences)
- b) We use the Present perfect to talk about activities that started in the past and will finish in the future.
 - My cousin has studied Administration since 2015. (He will finish in 2019)
- c) We also use the Present perfect to talk about activities that we might repeat.
 - They have gone to Montañita three times. (They want to go again)

FOR + duration of time **NOW**

I have been living in Japan **since** 2012.

I have been living in Japan **for** 4 years.

since 2012

for 4 years

FOR + period of time
+ number + time word

When we measure the duration of something or how long it lasts. It has a start point and an end point and can be used in different tenses.

- I studied English in Ireland **for** 2 years.
- I will be there **for** around two months.
- We have been married **for** 14 years.

for ten minutes
for eight hours
for five days
for six months
for three years
for two centuries

SINCE + starting point
+ a time / a date

When something started in the past and continues until now. **Since** is mostly used in the present perfect and perfect progressive tense.

- He hasn't eaten **since** 7 o'clock.
- I have been working here **since** June.
- We have been married **since** 2002.

since 8 o'clock
since Monday
since February
since 1982
since I left school
since the end of last century
