Exercise 1

Read the verb "to be" in the present simple tense and say it aloud:

I am	We are
You are	You are
He is	They are
She is	
It is	

Which words are the "pronouns"?

Exercise 2

Complete the sentences using the correct form of the verb "to be" in the present simple tense. Number 1 is an example:

Exercise 3

1. Do we use "going to" to talk about the past (before), the present (now) or the future (after now)?
2. Can we use "go to" to talk about the future?.....
Which three letters does "go" need to end in for the future?

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Exercise 4

When we ask a **question**, the **pronoun** and the **verb** change places. The **verb goes first** and it is **followed by the pronoun**:

Statement

I **am** going to get a detention.

You **are** going to go to AL12.

He **is** going to be sick.

Question

Am I going to get a detention?

Are you going to go to AL12?

Is he going to be sick?

Rewrite the statements as **questions**. Do not forget to use a **question mark**. Number 1 is an example:

Exercise 5

Neither the **statements** nor the **questions** tell us when these actions are happening.

When we ask a **"when"** question, it must be followed by the **verb then the pronoun**, just like a question:

Statement

You **are** going to London.

She **is** going to see the dentist.

"When" Question

When are you going to London?

When is she going to see the dentist?

So: When + auxiliary verb + pronoun + lexical verb...
