(-) -----	subject + don't / doesn't + verb +	You don't play football. She doesn't play football.
(?) -----	Do/Does + subject + verb +	You don't play football. She doesn't play football.

We **don't / doesn't visit / visits** our grandparents on Wednesdays.

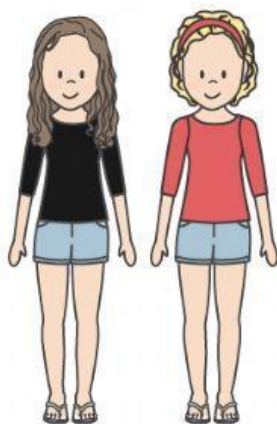
You **visit / visits** your aunt and uncle on Sundays.
