*** Please, try to memorize the verb correspondence.**

Type I - Possible

If Clause: **Simple Present** Main Clause: **Will + verb**

Ex: If she has money, she will buy a beach house.
 Present **S. Future**

Type II – Possible but unlikely / Impossible

If Clause: **Simple Past** Main Clause: **Would + verb**

Ex: If she had money, she would buy a beach house. (Impossible at present)
 S. Past **would + verb**

Ex: If I were you, I would study harder. (**Impossible**)

Conditional Type III – Impossible

(It is in the past, and you can't change the past)

If Clause: **Past Perfect** Main Clause: **Would have + Past Participle**

Ex: If she had had money, she would have bought a beach house.
 Past Perfect **would have + Past Participle**
