

Conditional Clauses (I, II, III) – irregular verbs

- (1) The team would have been very happy if they (beat) the other team.
- (2) If he (not do) his homework on time, the teacher will get angry.
- (3) If the dog had not bitten him, Joe (not bleed).
- (4) If the wind (blow) stronger, we wouldn't go to the festival.
- (5) I (bring) you a present if I had known that it was your birthday.
- (6) We will go have a picnic tomorrow if it (not rain).
- (7) If he (be) on time, we wouldn't have to wait for him.
- (8) If the bricklayer (build) a higher wall, the dog would not jump over it.
- (9) He would not have got a plaster cast if he (not break) his leg.
- (10) My mom will be happy if I (write) a good mark in this test.
- (11) The little boy would not cry if his parents (buy) him the other toy.
- (12) If you had run faster, your brother (not catch) you.
- (13) Sam would have been really sad if Tom (not choose) him for his team.
- (14) Would you buy this book if it (cost) €50?
- (15) If he (not have) time today, we would meet him another time.
- (16) If I had known that little George loves butterflies, I (draw) one for him.
- (17) Dad would be on time if he (drive) faster.
- (18) You wouldn't have felt sick if you (not eat) all the chocolate.
- (19) If grandma (not fall) down the stairs, she wouldn't have had to go to the hospital.
- (20) The parents would be very upset if the boys (fight) again.
- (21) What would you do if you (find) €100 on the street?
- (22) If I (fly) to New York, I would visit the Empire State Building first.
- (23) If he (get) a bike for his birthday, he would have been very surprised.
- (24) What would you do if your parents (forget) your birthday?
- (25) What would you do if you (hear) a baby cry?
- (26) The children would not have found the presents if we (hide) them better.
- (27) Nobody would take your stuff if you (keep) it in your room.
- (28) She will go shopping if she (have) enough money.
- (29) Would you tell me if you (know) the correct answer?
- (30) Mum would have been very happy if we (lay) the breakfast table.
