SHOW UP (Informal)=to appear.

SET UP =establish oneself in a business or profession.

PUT UP = stay temporarily.

PUT SOMEONE UP = give accommodation.

GROW UP (of people) = become an adult, mature.

END UP (Informal) = end.

DRAW UP (of a vehicle) come to a stop.

CALL SOMETHING UP= recall to the memory.

KEEP UP (of weather) = remain unchanged.

FIX UP = arrange something.
