### IMPORTANT

✓ Use the preposition **IN** with: \_\_\_\_\_, year, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, points of time in the future and duration (within a maximum period).

Ex: **In** March, **In** 1996, **In** summer, **In** the morning, **In** two weeks.

✓ Use the preposition **AT** with: parts of the day, \_\_\_\_\_, points in time.

Ex: **At** night, **At** 7:00 o'clock, **At** Easter

✓ Use the preposition **ON** with \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, a particular part of the day.

Ex: **On** Sunday, **On** December 25<sup>th</sup>, **On** the morning of September 11<sup>th</sup>.
