Present perfect with *ever* and *never*

Examples:

I've been to El Chaltén three times.

We've never seen a condor.

She's had a wonderful experience.

He hasn't climbed the Fitz Roy mountain.

Have you ever ridden a horse? Yes, I have.

No, I haven't.
