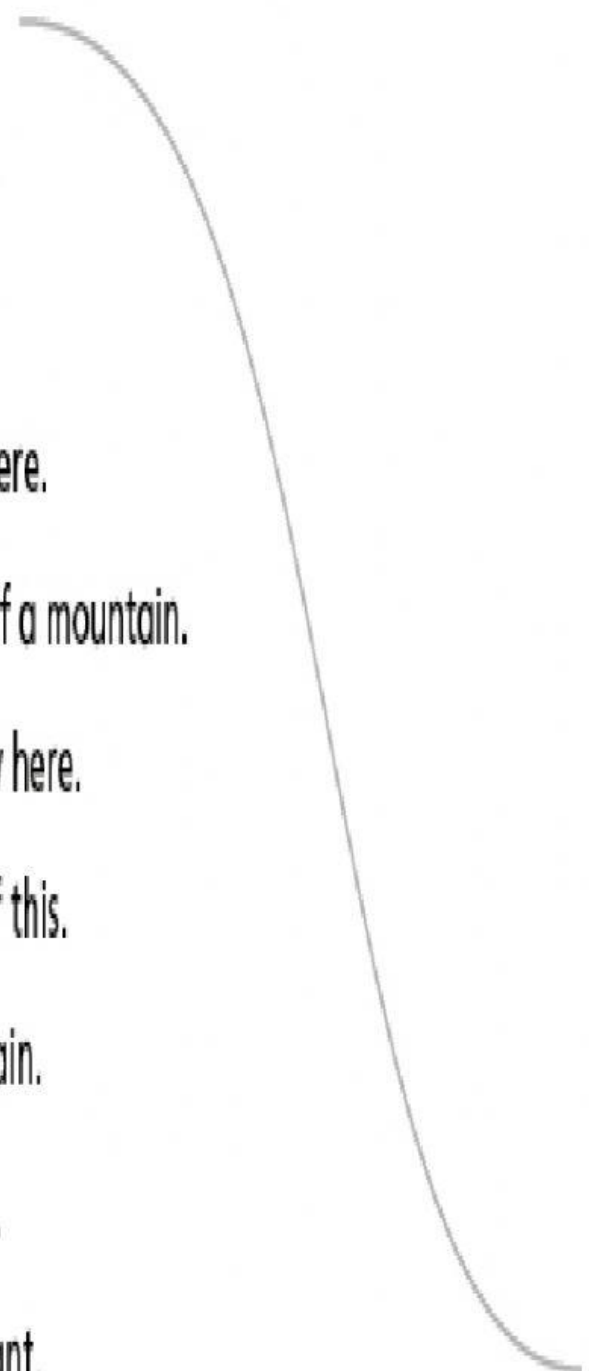

Short superlative adjectives (with *est*)

- Mount Cook is **the highest** mountain in New Zealand.
- **The largest** volcano in New Zealand is called Mount Ruapehu.
- The howler monkey is **the noisiest** animal in the world.
- The kakapo is **the heaviest** species of parrot.



Long superlative adjectives (with *most*)

- The Waitomo Caves are one of **the most popular** tourist attractions in New Zealand.
- **The most venomous** animal in the world is the box jellyfish.
- The Moa was a big bird. It lived in New Zealand. **The most interesting** fact about the Moa is that it didn't have any wings.

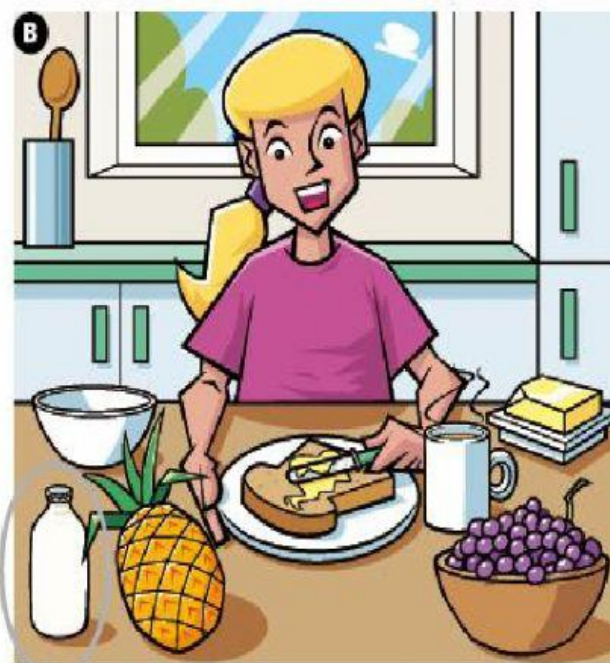

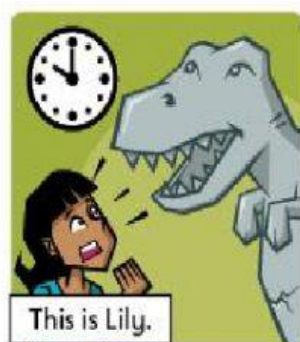
