Summary of the Creation Story.

Genesis chapter one and two: In the beginning, when God created the universe, the earth was formless and desolate. The raging ocean that covered everything was engulfed in total darkness, and the Spirit of God was moving over the water.

On the first day, God commanded that there be light. He divided the light from darkness creating day and night.

On day two, God commanded a dome to separate the water under it from the water above it, creating the sky.

On day three, God commanded the water below

the sky to come together, creating the land. He named the land Earth and the water He named sea.

On the fourth day, God created two larger lights. The sun to rule over the day and the moon and the stars to rule over the night.

On the fifth day, God commanded the sea to be filled with living beings and the air filled with birds.
