Word	Explanation	Example
<b>borrow</b>	to take and use smth. that belongs to smb. else	I'd like to <b>borrow</b> your umbrella.
<b>lend</b>	to give smth. to smb. that belongs to you	I can <b>lend</b> you my umbrella.
