

Rise Raise

To raise and to rise can both mean to go up but there is a difference. Look at these examples , then choose raise or rise to complete the rules.

We use rise / raise when there is no object after the verb. When something goes up naturally . It can also mean **to get up** in the morning.

We use rise / raise with an object , to say that someone makes something go up . It can also mean **to help children to grow up** , or **to mention something in a discussion**.

Raise is a regular verb (raise-raised-raised) . Rise is irregular (rise-rose-risen)
