ACROSS=communicate

AWAY: escape

DOWN TO: turn
one's attention to

BY: manage, cope

AWAY WITH: escape
punishment

TO: reach

ALONG: be on good terms
with somebody

OVER: recover from illness

GET

AT: criticize

IN= deliver

UP TO: do

OFF: disembark (bus, train)

ON: enter
(bus, train....)

THROUGH: be connected on the phone
