We use **don't have to** / **doesn't have to** like this:

We have to do homework.	I don't have to clean the table.
I have to clean the table.	We don't have to take out the rubbish.
They have to cut the grass.	They don't have to wash the car.
You have to visit the dentist.	You don't have to go to the library.
John has to water the plants.	Nora doesn't have to rake the leaves.
She has to go shopping.	She doesn't have to set the table.
Sara has to do the washing-up.	Nathan doesn't have to clean the house.
He has to shovel the snow.	He doesn't have to feed the fish.
