

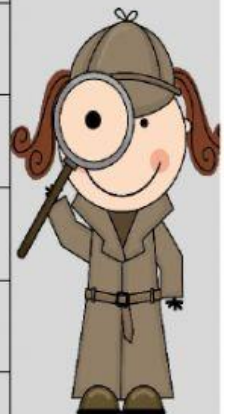


## VOCABULARY: CRIMES AND CRIMINALS

| A     | taking someone away by force, demanding money for their safe return                       | X        |
| Ar    | setting fire to a building, cars or property on purpose                                   |          |
| As    | killing a famous person or public figure                                                  |          |
| Ass   | attacking someone physically                                                              |          |
| B     | marrying someone when you are already married to another person                           |          |
| Bl    | threatening to reveal someone's secrets if a lot of money is not paid                     |          |
| Bo    | detonating an explosive device with the plan of harming people or property                |          |
| Br    | giving money or granting favors to influence another person's decisions or behavior       |          |
| Bu    | breaking into a house in order to steal something                                         |          |
| Ch    | treating a child badly in a physical, emotional, or sexual way                            |          |
| Co    | behaving illegally and dishonestly; especially those in power                             | X        |
| Cr    | doing something illegal that can be punished by law                                       |          |
| Cy    | doing something illegal over the Internet or a computer system                            | Cy<br>H  |
| D     | behaving violently inside the home                                                        | X        |
| Dr    | driving with too much alcohol in your blood                                               |          |
| Em    | stealing large amounts of money that you are responsible for, often over a period of time |          |

| Es  | spying, to obtain political or military information                                     |   |
| F   | illegally copying documents, money, etc. to cheat people                                |   |
| Fr  | getting money from people by cheating them                                              |   |
| G   | killing on purpose a large number of people, especially from a particular group or area | X |
| H   | taking control of a plane, train, etc, by force often to meet political demands         |   |
| Ho  | killing another person on purpose                                                       | X |
| Hoo | being violent or aggressive on purpose; often used to describe youth                    |   |
| K   | taking someone away by force, often demanding money for their safe return               |   |
| L   | taking things illegally and by force, during a riot, war, etc.                          |   |
| M   | killing someone by accident                                                             | X |
| Mu  | attacking someone with a plan to rob them                                               |   |
| Mur | killing someone on purpose                                                              |   |
| P   | stealing wallets, money, etc. from people's pockets in crowded places                   |   |
| Po  | hunting illegally                                                                       |   |
| R   | forcing someone to have sex                                                             |   |
| Ri  | causing a noisy, violent public disturbance                                             |   |
| Sh  | stealing something from a store                                                         |   |
| Sm  | taking things secretly in or out of a place, country, jail, etc.                        |   |
| T   | using violence, threats, or fear, usually for political purposes                        |   |
| Th  | stealing, in general                                                                    |   |
| Tr  | betraying one's country by helping its enemies                                          |   |
| V   | destroying private or public property purposely                                         |   |
