There is a special monument in the south of England called Stonehenge. It was built more than five thousand years ago using two different types of stone. The stones are huge, too big to have been transported by water.

It _____ that they were pulled to the site by ropes and hundreds of men, but we don't know for sure. The reason it was built is not really clear, but _____ that it was a holy site.
