- c) Use your piece of paper to classify them in 5 groups with the same type of irregularity, and one group with the rest.
- d) Now write the three forms of each verb IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER inside each group, and fill in the gaps in the example sentences with the correct form of one of the irregular verbs.
