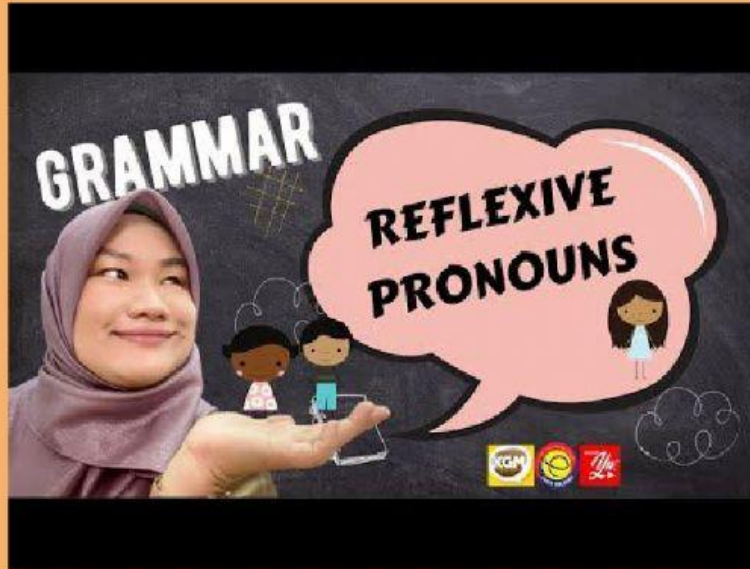

Relative Pronoun



Let's learn.

People **who** vandalise are called vandals.

The word in bold is called a relative pronoun.

Who, whom, and which are relative pronouns.

Examples:

1. The man **who** lives in the bungalow is my uncle.
We use 'who' as the subject to refer to the 'man'.
2. They hired the man **whom** we interviewed yesterday.
We use 'whom' as the object to refer to the 'man'.
3. The car **which** my brother was driving last night was my father's.
We use 'which' as the object to refer to the 'car'.

Who or whom refers to people.
Who comes before the verb.
Whom comes after the first verb.
