### The History of the Olympic Games

The Olympic Games became famous in the Greek world in the sixth century BC. Every four years athletes travelled many kilometers to take part in this competition. The ceremony was originally a religious festival in honor of the Greek god Zeus. But in 394 AD, the Roman emperor decided to stop the festival, so there were no games for more than 1,000 years.

In 1896, Pierre de Coubertin, a Frenchman, convinced thirteen nations to take part in the first modern Games in Athens, Greece. Since that year, the Olympic Games take place every four years and the event is very important for sportsmen and women all over the world. There are also the Paralympic Games for athletes with a disability and the Youth Olympic Games for teenagers between the ages of 14 and 18. The official symbol of the modern Games is five colored rings: they represent the continents of America, Asia, Africa, Europe and Australia.

Unfortunately, sometimes there are problems. In 1916, 1940 and 1944 the Olympic Games did not take place because of war. In 1980, the American team did not go to the Moscow Games and in 1984 the team from the Soviet Union did not go to the Games in Los Angeles.

Luckily, when people remember the Olympic Games of the past they remember the good parts: the gold medals, the new world records and, of course, the mascots. Perhaps the most popular mascot is Vinicius, the friendly pet that introduced the 2016 Games in Rio. It was a mixture of lots of Brazilian animals and it symbolized the energy of the Brazilian people.
