

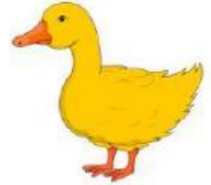
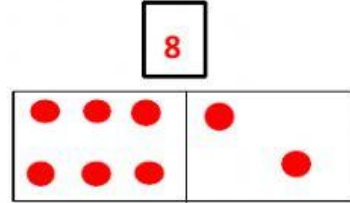
Lesson: Stories about joining

Example: Rasha sees 6 ducks in her garden. Then 2 more ducks fly into the garden. How many ducks are there in all?

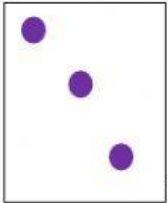
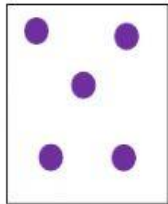
$$\underline{6} + \underline{2} = \underline{8}$$
