

Grammar: Present Simple: Affirmative and Negative

We use the present simple to talk about facts and routines.

We make negative statements in the simple present with *don't* and *doesn't*.

Affirmative	Negative
I go to an after-school program.	I don't go home after school.
You walk to school.	You don't walk home.
She plays with her friends. He plays soccer.	She doesn't play with me. He doesn't play basketball.
We share snacks.	We don't share our dinner.
They ride bikes in the park.	They don't ride bikes to school.
