### AFFIRMATIVE FORM IN PAST SIMPLE

Subject + **verb in past**

I **went** to school yesterday.

### NEGATIVE FORM IN SIMPLE PAST

Subject + **didn't** + **verb in its base form**

I **didn't go** to school yesterday because I was sick.

### INTERROGATIVE FORM IN PAST SIMPLE

**Did** + subject + **verb in its base form**?

**Did** your sister **go** to school yesterday?
