

Making plurals of nouns that end in "F" and "FE"

A. Some nouns that end in "f", "ffe", and "fe"; form their plural by simply adding "s".

cliff →cliffs

giraffe →giraffes

reef →reefs

chef →chefs













chief →chiefs

handcuff →handcuffs

B. With some nouns that end in "f", or "fe", you remove the(f) or (fe) and add "ves" to make the noun plural.
