

QUALIFIERS / INTENSIFIERS

Qualifiers / intensifiers are words like *very, too, so, quite, rather*. Qualifiers are function parts of speech. They do not have synonyms. Their sole purpose is to "qualify" or "intensify" an adjective or an adverb. Qualifiers / intensifiers modify adjectives or adverbs, telling to what degree.

EX: I ran down the old(adjective) stairs quickly(adverb)

I ran down the old stairs rather(qualifier) quickly(adverb)

I ran down the rather(qualifier) old(adjective) stair quickly
