Rentap is a hero of Sarawak. Do you know what he did to be called 'a hero'? Read and rearrange the paragraphs to find out.

Rentap attacked the fort in 1853 and defeated the British there. The next year, Brooke's men attacked Rentap's fort at Long River. Rentap escaped to Bukit Sadok and built a fort there.

In 1857, James Brooke sent Charles Brooke to attack Rentap's fort at Bukit Sadok but they were defeated. Charles Brooke attacked the fort again the next year. He failed again.

Rentap was a famous Iban warrior in Sarawak. He was the leader of the Ibans in Skrang and Saribas. He fought against the British led by James Brooke between 1840 – 1860.

On 27th July 1993, the Sarawak government declared Rentap a hero of Sarawak. He had fought bravely to defend his land and his people.

In 1861, James Brooke's men attacked Rentap at Bukit Sadok again. Rentap was defeated. He escaped to Entabai. He died of old age in the 1870s.

In early 1850, Brooke built a fort at Nanga Skrang. Rentap was angry because the fort prevented the Ibans from getting to the sea easily.
