REMEMBER TO USE

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ACTION VERBS FOR LESSON LEARNT

Example: Jack **swore** never to lie to his mother again! He turned over a new leaf and gave up being a compulsive liar. From that day on, he never even told a white lie!

1. **SCENARIO:** You were caught cheating in an examination.
ACTION VERB: vowed

2. **SCENARIO:** As a result of not reading labels, you accidentally consumed detergent instead of medicine.

ACTION VERB: swore

3. **SCENARIO:** Your best friend got you into trouble by shoplifting and blaming it on you.

ACTION VERB: made a firm decision

4. **SCENARIO:** After spilling the beans about your father's surprise party, everybody in your family is mad at you.

ACTION VERB: solemnly promised

5. **SCENARIO:** You almost set your house on fire after you left the stove unattended.

ACTION VERB: pledged

6. **SCENARIO:** As a result of not being careful while crossing the road, you almost got into an accident.

ACTION VERB: assured

7. **SCENARIO:** You dilly-dallied and missed the deadline of an important school project.
