We use **INFINITIVES** after the next verbs: want, need, plan, learn, use, try, ask, hope, remember, forget, offer, promise, etc. and expressions such as would like and would love.

We use **GERUNDS** after the next verbs: like, dislike, love, enjoy, hate, etc. and after prepositions: in, at, on, for, about, etc.
